Neal Adams remains my favorite comic artist of all time. Before he and Denny O'Neil redefined the Dark Knight (and likely saved him from the joke he had become in pop culture due to the old TV show) Adams took a B tier character, Deadman, and wrote stories that still hold up today. If you are a fan of Neal Adams you should own this.

This book tells the whole story with the Sensei (leading up to the stories that would occur in Batman and Detective with the League of Assassins) It also has Adams Brave and the Bold story where Batman's costume is colored by zip-a-tone. A very weird, but cool effect.

Even if the stories are dated (and they are), they are serviceable. And Neal Adams could always take serviceable stories and make them shine by his stunning artwork. This collection is no exception.
