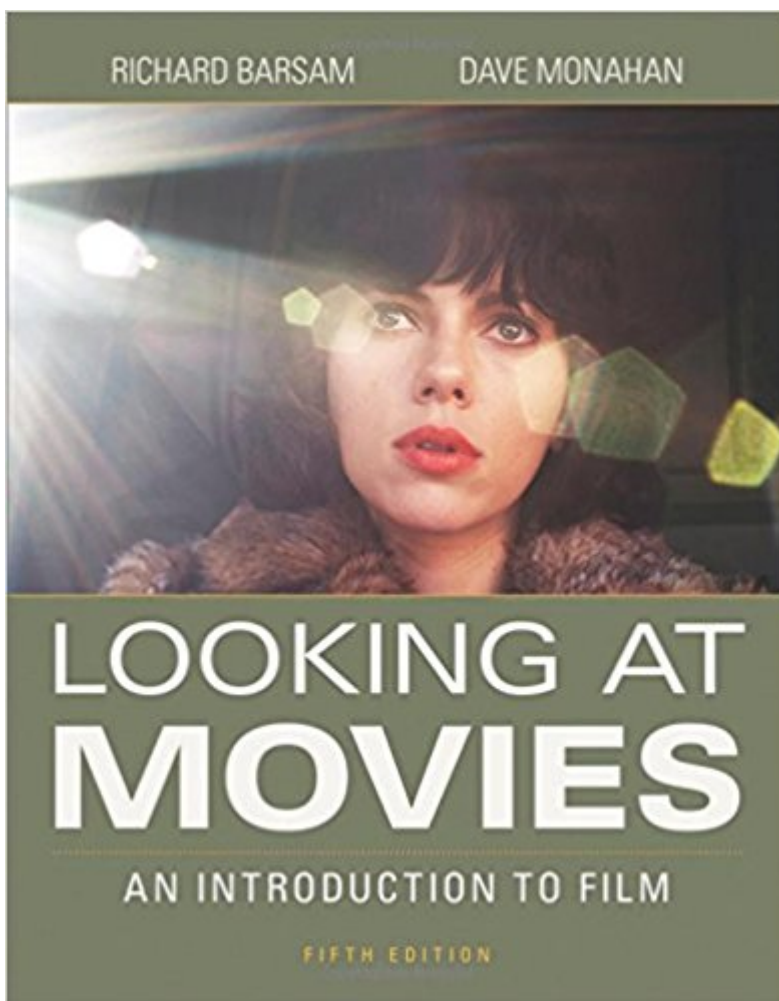

This is the one book you'll need as a great introduction into the industry. My new book also included a code to their website where it's full of small video examples and tons, I say it again, tons of references to movies for future research (and enjoyment). The format is a bit off but it's done so purposefully to keep people engaged with the material. For those interested in more of the history of films, you don't get into that until Chapter 10, but nevertheless, one could always jump around chapters to find out more about a particular topic in films. Granted, I'm having to read this book from a course I'm taking at Berklee but even if I weren't a student and wanting to know about films, this would be THE book to read.
