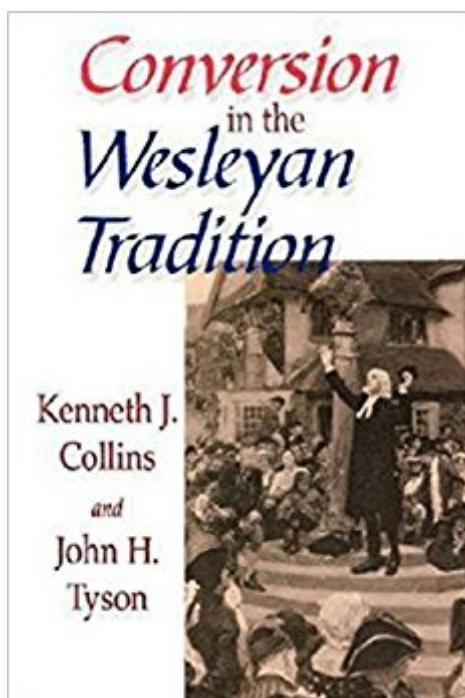

The compilation within the book strives to provide a picture of conversion from a number of perspectives, including: biblical, historical, theological, and practical. Out of these various perspectives one is able to not only understand the importance of conversion within the Wesleyan tradition, but also to strive and continue to proclaim the saving truth of the Gospel.

The book compiled by Dr. Ken Collins and John Tyson is a real treat , along with getting the history of conversion in the Wesleyan movement we get the progressive and evangelical acts in which there are articles about the abolition movement women's suffrage. One can see how evangelical and progressive the Wesleyan movement is while staying true to biblical principles.
