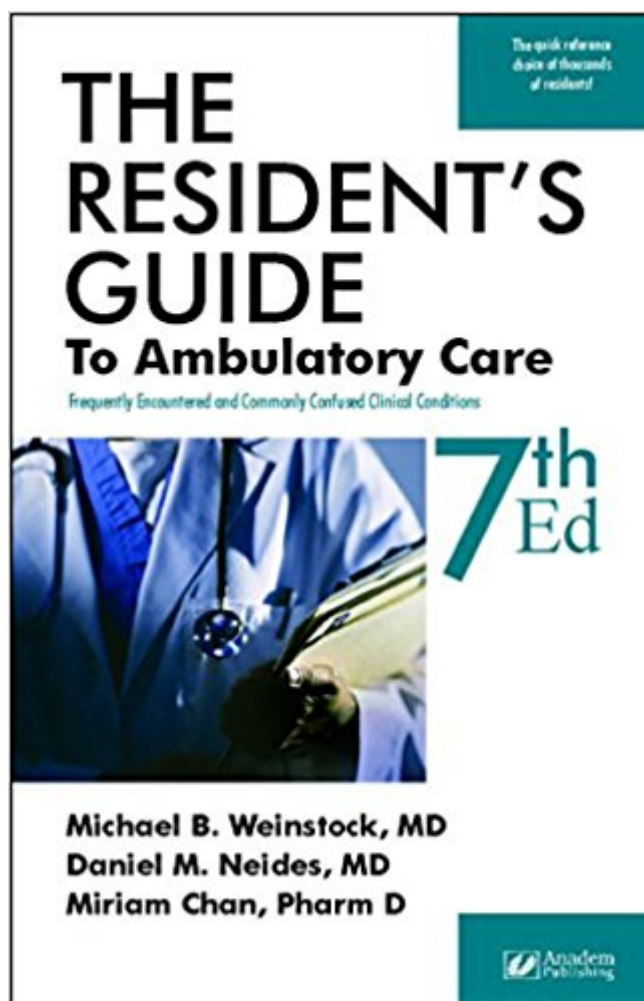

Emergency Department Cases: ED Returns*, *Bouncebacks: Medical and Legal* and the soon to be released *Bouncebacks: Pediatrics*, a series of books with an engaging and unique format and reviews in *Annals of Emergency Medicine* and *JAMA*. Michael was recently appointed risk management section editor of *Mel Herbert's Emergency Medicine Reviews and Perspectives (EM RAP)*, a CME program with international circulation to over 15,000 physicians. Michael has lectured nationally on issues such as risk management and patient safety and has published papers in peer-reviewed journals.

Daniel M. Neides, M.D., MBA, is the Medical Director and Chief Operating Officer of the Cleveland Clinic Wellness Institute. Dr. Neides is board-certified in Family Medicine and has practiced at The Cleveland Clinic since 1996. He earned both his undergraduate and medical degrees from Ohio State University, followed by a residency in Family Medicine at Riverside Methodist Hospital in Columbus. Also no nebulizer treatments for acute exacerbation of COPD or paediatric acute respiratory distress. Otherwise really like format, like clinical pearls. Like algorithms. Like medication charts, dosages.
