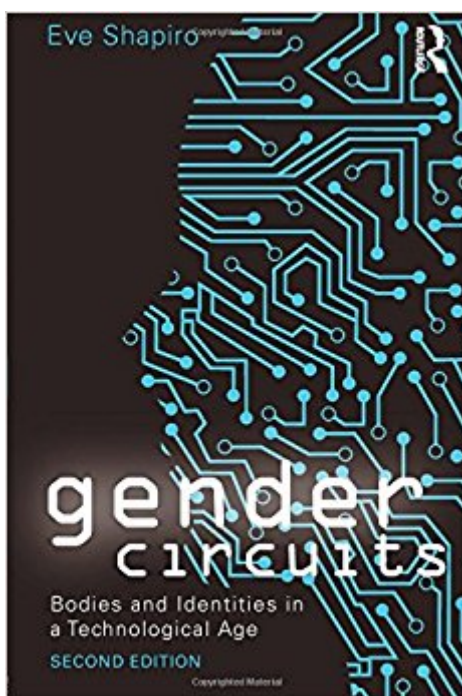

Dr. Eve Shapiro is a Visiting Research Scholar at the Center for Research on Women and Social Justice at the University of California, Santa Barbara. Her current research elaborates examines the myriad ways new technologies can be purposefully used to reshape individual and community lives, particularly around gender and sexuality.

While not a lot of new material on feminism for the socially-justice minded, this book did do much towards moving me to think about how technology has developed both to express traditional gender roles and to deconstruct them. The second chapter (I believe) starts off with a short anecdote about the musical *Kinky Boots*, in which a shoemaker decides to invent a specific type of heel for drag queens, for example. While sociologists and activists tend to think of technologies and objects as politically neutral (ie. the only agency they have is that which is given to them by a user), this book does a good job in talking about how designers have very real beliefs and politics about gender that goes into what they make.

The book arrived promptly, and was in perfect condition! It was a very interesting read, and not too technical so just about anyone can pick it up and understand perfectly.
