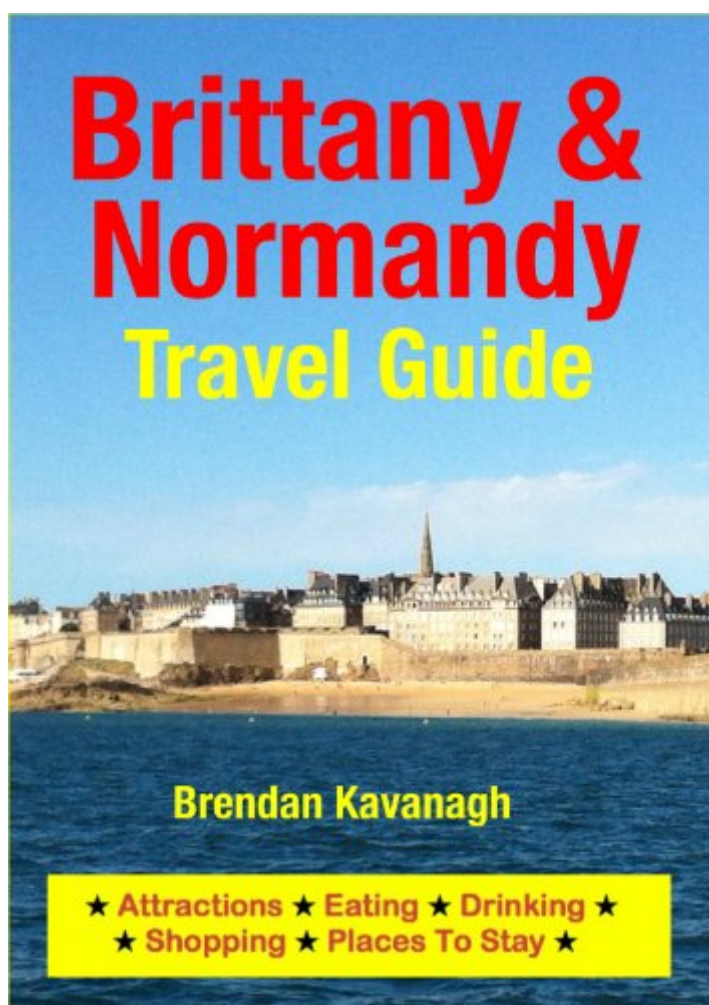


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Brittany & Normandy Travel Guide - Attractions, Eating, Drinking, Shopping & Places To Stay
