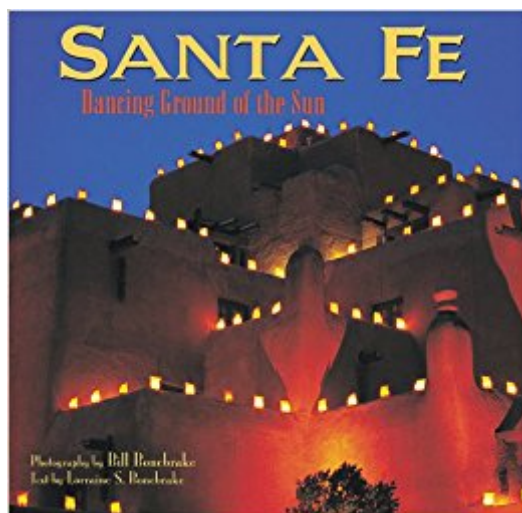

Bill's full-color photos capture the adobe architecture in all four seasons and give you a series of snapshots that give you the flavor of the town. Lorraine Bonebrake has written accompanying text that tells you what you're looking at and describes the town of Santa Fe (pop: 70,000) as it is these days, as a town struggling to hold onto its traditions while changing with the times. As the oldest city in America, Santa Fe has more history to hold onto than most towns, and as such the battles over the past and how best to preserve it become rather contentious. That said, this book is a pleasure to read, and the pictures are a feast for the eyes. This is a little book, a first dish or appetizer rather than a feast, but it deserves a place in any library about the Southwest or Santa Fe or New Mexico in particular. Its used versions are easy on the wallet, and you can pick up a copy of this book for a couple of bucks, which makes it a good deal.
