

The book, The Night the White Deer Died, is written by three time Newbery award winner, Gary Paulsen. It is about a fifteen-year-old girl named Janet Carson, who lives in a small town in New Mexico in the year 1978. Janet is lonely and hardly has any good friends. What worries her is a recurring dream she has each night. In her dream, a beautiful white doe begins to drink from a moonlit pool. Suddenly, an Indian brave appears, notches a bow, and then shoots it at the deer. Time then freezes, and Janet wakes up. Janet is not able to understand the dream at all, and it

begins to haunt her. She becomes depressed, until she meets Billy Honcho, a drunken, fifty-three year old Indian. In meeting him, Janet not only makes sense out of her mysterious dream, but she also falls in love. I chose the book because I was attracted to its title. However, I was disappointed because the book was not very suspenseful, and that was a major let down for me. For this reason, I would not recommend this book to readers who like action-filled and suspenseful plots. On the other hand, readers who enjoy books about troubled characters and how they overcome their problems may want to read this book.
