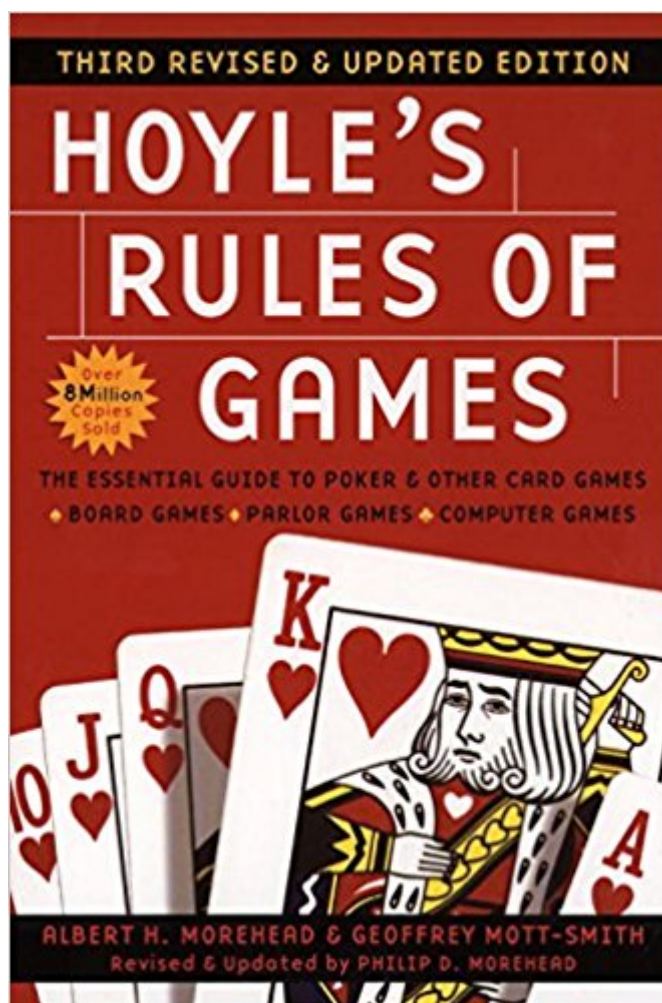

We have an older version and I often refer to it to remind me of rules of games. Sometimes I have found that an older game such as one I played with the grandmother (Spite and Malice) now has a new name and is in box form which I have played with a granddaughter. Such a good game under either name (can't remember the current one, sorry)! When I played with my grandmother, all we needed was a couple decks of cards. Now it comes in a game box and, of course, there is a price tag on it. Still, it is reasonable and I highly recommend it for all ages. Our granddaughter was nine or ten when I introduced it to her and she picked up on it immediately. Note, she is a games enthusiastic.

I wanted to teach my young son how to play several of my favorite card games. Unfortunately, several of them (mostly versions of rummy) weren't covered in this book. I guess some card games aren't as popular as they once were. I can't really recommend it, particularly the Kindle version (you can't get back to the table of contents from the text without going back to the beginning of the book.)

Nice overview of many games, but I expected something more comprehensive. Example: some Rummy games that I played years ago are not in here, or I can't find them. An index would be nice.

This is not a bad collection of game information, however it really just wasn't what I was looking for. This being said I would recommend this to people looking to learn some more commonly played games, just don't expect to find a lot of information for card games that do not use a French suited bicycle deck. (In other words a poker deck). I was really hoping to find some new games using Spanish suited Baraja decks or German suited Magyar decks.

Just what I needed. We never can remember the rules to card games....now I have it at my fingertips

Mainly bought this book to argue some Euchre rules to some friends of ours. I even learned a couple new things myself. Pretty excited to have my first book of Hoyle & learn some of these card
