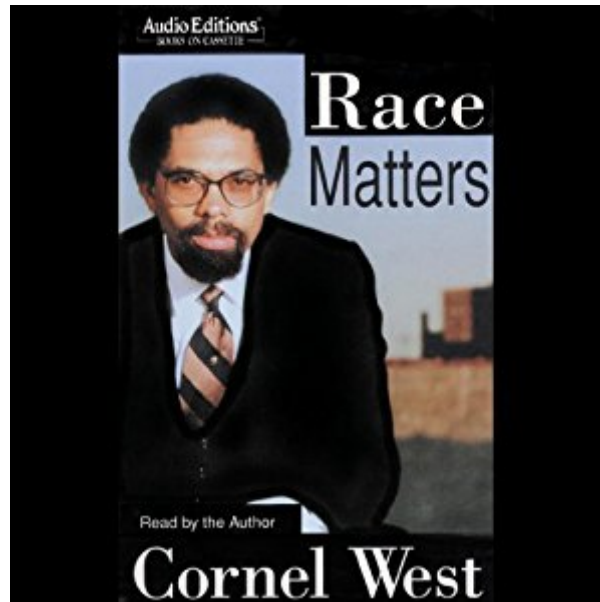

With a voice intelligent and packed to the temples with the facts of events and markers of history, he leaves the reader feeling both the rapid exhaust of his thought and the decompression of racial futures.
