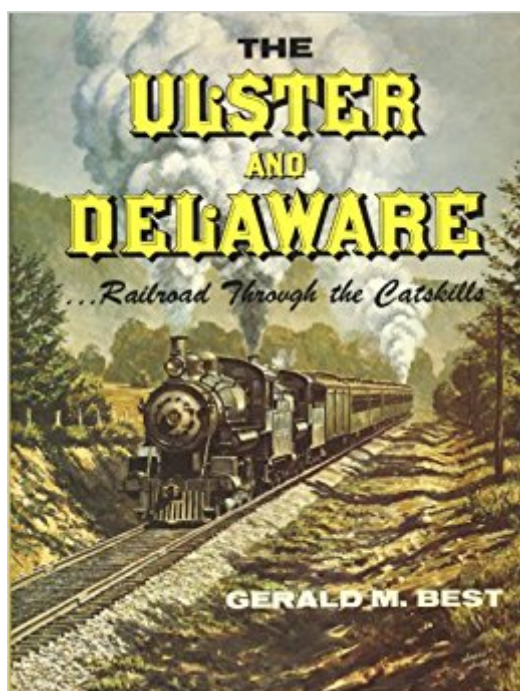

As a boy in Port Jervis, New York, the author developed a keen interest in railroads and the history of his home state. He first saw the Catskill Mountains from the train window while going from Port Jervis to Kingston with his father who was tracing the Decker family history and Samuel Decker Coykendall offered him help. Best came away with a lasting impression of a dignified, gracious man and little did he realize that half a century later he would research the story of the Ulster & Delaware Railroad, of which Coykendall was then president. Gerald M. Best is a name well known among historians, especially in railroad circles. His writings about the steam locomotive and railroad history have appeared in many journals, his locomotive photographs grace the pages of numerous books. Those who have read his six books will find the same authentic and careful research in The Ulster &

Delaware...Railroad Through the Catskills.

Gerald M. Best was a very prolific author of books in the railfan genre. Most of his works were about Western railroads and he received several awards from the National Railroad Historical Society. The *Ulster & Delaware: Railroad Through The Catskills*, about a once prosperous shortline in upstate New York, is one of Best's better known books and deservedly so. It is written in a very pleasant style that carries the reader easily through all of the company's corporate shenanigans in the latter 19th Century Gilded Age of Robber Barons. Many railroad histories become deadly boring tomes on this subject but Best carries it off with aplomb. A chapter is devoted to the many, some great, old boarding hotels in the Catskill Mountain vacation country and is presented with a nostalgic charm befitting a long passe genteel lifestyle. This region was NOT part of the Borst Belt of Sullivan County. It is the area where the legendary Rip Van Winkle roamed (and slept). The only weakness of this book is that it is old. Having been published nearly two generations ago by an author of the old school of railfans, it covers steam locomotives in great detail, but refers to their replacement simply as "diesels". Except for a couple of photos, this subject is not touched at all. Physically this is a very attractive book with good photo reproduction and typography as is expected from the publisher, Golden West Books.

This book should be of great interest not only for someone who grew up in the Catskill Mountain region of New York State and has fond memories of the area, but also for anyone who wants to learn more about that relatively short period of time (the 1870s to 1920s) when railroads were the dominant mode of transportation for both passengers and freight within the US. In addition, the book provides a good picture of what life was like around the turn of the 20th century for vacationers from NYC who sailed up the Hudson on the Day Liners to Kingston or Catskill for their train ride into the mountains to one of the big old resort hotels. An excellent read plus plenty of great photographs.
