

This is a very good book, but not for total beginners. When you start to read this, you definitely have to have some clues about Japanese language and its structure. Stories are cute and easy but there are omissions in translations and if you are not used to Japanese language and expect everything to be translated as it is written... there would be some problems. I bought paperback, so I can check if I don't understand something but now I see that there is no paperback version anymore. I got the audio book for free with the paperback and that was a very good thing because it helps me a lot with my pronunciation. So I would definitely recommend it as a studying tool.

There isn't a lot of good reading content available for beginners of Japanese, and a lot of what is out there is very expensive. So when I saw this available for just \$0.99 cents, I jumped right on it. The stories are around maybe N4 level, so are appropriate for someone who has been studying for maybe about a year or two. There are 9 stories which are split up into 3 chapters each, with each chapter being maybe 6-10 pages on average. Each line of Japanese has furigana, and is followed by an English translation. I have mixed feelings on this. While the English translation lets you immediately figure out new words, on the other hand, it doesn't give you a chance to figure things out on your own, which I feel is an important part of learning. It's possible to blow through this without really comprehending the Japanese, because you can just rely on the English. And because the English is \*right there\*, its almost impossible to avoid reading it even if you wanted to.I also have to say that this book could definitely have used some more proofreading. It has several small mistakes and typos here and there in the Japanese (my wife is Japanese and verified this for me). Hopefully this can be corrected in future versions of the book. But for the most part, its fine. You get 9 pretty good short stories here for a cheap price, so if you have been studying Japanese for a little while and are looking for something to practice reading, then I would definitely recommend picking this up!\*\*\* I would also like to mention a problem that I had viewing this on the Android Kindle app, in case anyone else has similar issues. When I first tried to read the book, for some reason the periods and commas were out of alignment, and made it very difficult to read. I tried downloading a sample from another random Japanese book, and then I got a notification saying that the kindle app downloaded Japanese fonts. After that, everything showed up correctly in this book. I'm not sure if this is a problem with the kindle app, or maybe something with this book, but if you have a similar problem, just try that.

In my opinion the translations are not very good, as the do not stick closely to the Japanese text.

To say this book is for beginners is a bit misleading. Although the kanji that are covered are basic enough, the vocabulary is not. In addition, I feel like you have to have a real solid understanding of Japanese grammar before starting this book. I do, however, like the layout of the book which includes the sentence in Japanese and the English translation directly below it. It also has a glossary at the end of each short story. This book would be great for an intermediate student (so much so that I would be inclined to give it a 4 or 5 star rating). However, I cannot recommend this book for beginners and would advise you to either build up your grammar and vocabulary before reading this book or just to look elsewhere.

This is a good collection of stories for practicing reading at the beginner level.Please note this book is not for absolute beginners. You'll need to know the writing system and at least basic grammar to parse any of the text. Where this volume can help you is making the jump from grammar exercises, flash cards, etc. to actually deciphering real sentences and reading native material.If you don't want to see the translation while you're reading the Japanese, you'll need a piece of paper or an index card to slide down the page. Otherwise, you won't be able to avoid seeing the translations immediately underneath each line. Perhaps one upshot of this arrangement is that with the audiobook you can readily practice the "Listening-Reading" method.As other reviews noted, some translations are rather liberal, but that isn't necessarily a bad thing. Direct ("literal") translations often fail to capture key meanings or implications. There are many typos and grammatical errors throughout. (Also oddly enough, the back of the book says you'll learn Spanish the fun way.)The stories themselves are rather pedestrian and their authors are not credited. It's as if these stories written specifically for this book?

I purchased it for my kindle, this book is useful to learn vocabulary and to familiarize with the sentence order and other gramatical rules, while you read a simple and interesting story. You have the meaning right away so you can infer the meaning of some sentences if you don't know all the vocabulary. At the end of each chapter, you have an extensive list of words and grammatical explanations, so it is almost unnecessary to use a dictionary. It is an excellent product for the lower
