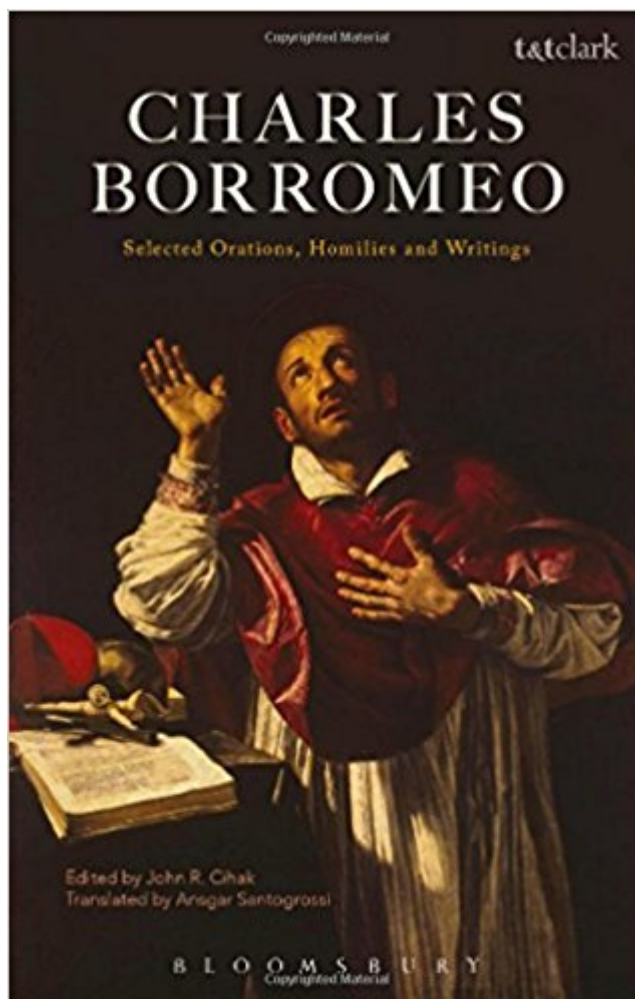

Charles Borromeo: Selected Orations, Homilies And Writings



Synopsis

Charles Borromeo (1538-1584) should have been part of the problem. As nephew of a Medici Pope who made him a Cardinal at 22 years of age, Borromeo could have become just another corrupt Renaissance Bishop. Instead he became the driving force of reform within the Catholic Church in the wake of the Council of Trent following the Protestant Reformation and the primary reason Trent's dramatic reforms were successful. His remarkable accomplishments in Milan as Archbishop became the model of reform for the rest of Western Europe. Change is never easy, but St. Charles's approach - deeply biblical, personal, practical and centered on Christ - offers a road map of reform, even for today. Now for the first time in over 400 years a significant selection of his works appears in the English language. Chapter One offers three orations that St Charles gave as Archbishop of Milan to the other Bishops. These texts were among those that Pope Paul VI sent out to the Bishops of the world in 1963 during Vatican II. These orations reveal Borromeo's foundational ideas of reform. Chapter Two contains a selection of homilies on the Eucharist, which for St. Charles was crucial for authentic and lasting reform. Chapter Three treats of the reform of the clergy, the reform for which Borromeo is most known and on which he spent most of his efforts. Recurrent Borromeoan themes to his priests are the greatness of the priestly vocation and the consequent necessity to live that call with integrity through humility, prayer and self-sacrifice. Chapter Four presents St. Charles's efforts at mobilizing the laity in their own reform of imbuing the secular world with holiness in the workplace and within the family. This translation is intended to be faithful to Borromeo's Latin or Italian texts rendered into contemporary English and is currently the largest collection of primary source material of his works in English.

John R. Cihak is an Official of the Congregation for Bishops and a Papal Master of Ceremonies at the Vatican. A priest of the Archdiocese of Portland in Oregon, USA, he studied philosophy at the University of Notre Dame and obtained his Licentiate and Doctorate in theology from the Pontifical Gregorian University, Rome, where he also teaches. Ansgar Santogrossi, O.S.B., is a Benedictine monk of Mount Angel Abbey and Adjunct Professor of Philosophy at Mount Angel Seminary in Oregon and at Our Lady of Guadalupe Seminary in Nebraska, USA. He earned his Doctorate in philosophy from the Institut Catholique de Paris. Charles Borromeo was a Cardinal and Archbishop of Milan, Italy, from 1564-1584. He was also a leader within the Counter-Reformation and was responsible for significant reforms in the Catholic Church.

This is a wonderful, well-researched book. It is an asset to anyone studying for the priesthood and for those who teach. Cihak, S.T.D., and translator Ansgar Santogrossi, O.S.B., PhD, created a book that can be read and clearly understood.

St. Charles Borromeo lived at a time when the Church seemed to be falling apart. There was a lack of holiness in those who had allegedly given their lives to Christ as His priests and religious. And there was a leadership vacuum as many bishops at the time lived outside of their dioceses and did little to lead or protect their flocks. The Church was in a time of crisis, as she so often is throughout history, including in our times. This book presents the response of a saint to difficult times. St. Charles Borromeo responded to the crisis with personal holiness as well as a pastoral plan of action that has something to teach bishops, priests, and laity in our times too. I found the lengthy historical introduction to be extremely helpful, even apart from the collection of Borromeo's own texts. The introduction painted a vivid picture of the times and circumstances in which Borromeo lived, and explained his strategies for meeting those times head-on "not with negativity and constant lamenting, but with hard work, leading by example, and faith in Jesus Christ, who promised that the

gates of hell would not prevail against the Church. This is a must-read for seminarians, deacons, priests, and bishops.

The great influence of this saint for the Church is still being realized today, and this book is a clear testament to that. This impressive collection of writings is a must read for priests, seminarians and all Catholic faithful who want to encounter St. Charles Borromeo in a new way. I highly encourage all those who may not know much about this saint to discover a man who although young, was a great defender of the Church and a true example of what it means to be a shepherd of souls. I highly recommend this book.
