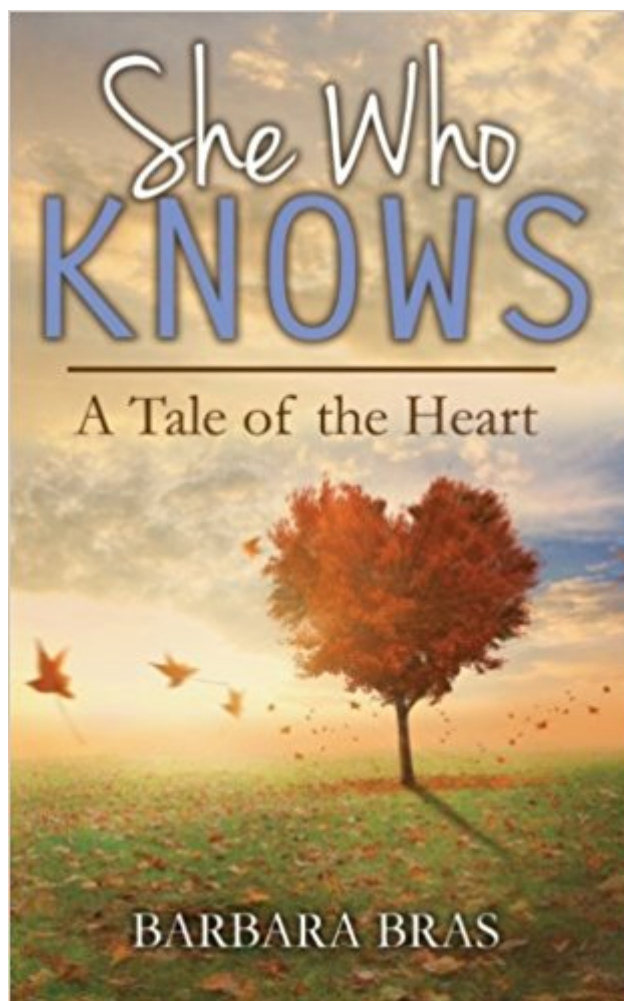

She Who Knows by Barbara Bras is a coming of age story about a young woman who is learning to navigate this world she lives in during the 1950s. At 5 years of age her mother passes and she herself has a heart problem and is sent away to live in her late grandparents' home in Maui. She is alone and secluded for health reasons but this also takes a toll on her emotions and socially. Adding a little fairytale mix to the story, at the age of 10 she dreams of the Menehune (which to me seems to be like fairies/leprechauns of European folklore) for the first time and these dreams stick with her. We are with her as she grows up and finally is allowed out into the real world where she encounters a little bit of bullying, she meets her mother's family whom she didn't even know existed, and she meets her very best friend. As she opens up her heart she discovers that she must forgive, that some pain is more than physical, and maybe her father really does love her. This is a sweet story and I enjoyed visiting Hawaii and being introduced to some of its folklore. There is a little bit of paranormal woven into the story as well, enough mysteriousness to keep you turning the pages. I would recommend this to young adults and adults alike.
