These cards are adorable; more than I could have hoped for! Pros: They're high quality, shiny, and every image is perfectly vintage. I've included pictures of all of the cards, and some close-ups of my favorites. Cons: The back of the cards have a lot of writing and part of it is right in the middle of the card! I don't understand why it's not on an edge somewhere; now I have to write around/over it or white it out which will look pretty terrible. Other than that they're great and I'm excited to send them out!

For the price, these are a great value. I bought another book of postcards that had some of the same reproductions and this book's version had much better colors and sharpness. Cards are glossy, so if you want matte, don't get these. Good variety of images; they run more cutesy and as the cover implies, focuses on kids. The cons: thinner cardstock, as others mentioned, because they are four cards on one sheet, you will have at least two crease edges that are not clean when you tear them. Cards are smaller than other books.

I bought this set of reproduction Halloween cards to use in mixed media art and frame some for some vintage Halloween decor. I loved the selection of cards, the colors of the prints are strong but not overpoweringly vivid and they are printed on glossy card stock.

I purchased these late last year. Sent them out earlier in the month. The reproductions of real postcards sent around the turn of the 20th century were impressive. The bright colors used in these illustrations were fantastic. I even used a few for a montage of my own since I love Halloween! Great Purchase. I did the same with some Christmas cards (postcards) too for 2010. Part of the history was people used to send out these postcards rather than greetings cards as we do in modern day. Going back to this tradition myself! These images are much better than the

love-dovey crap you get from hallmark cards etc....

The pictures themselves are really great, and I like that there's a decent amount of room to write on the back. What I don't like is the fact that the postcards are perforated, which I think makes them look kind of cheap.
