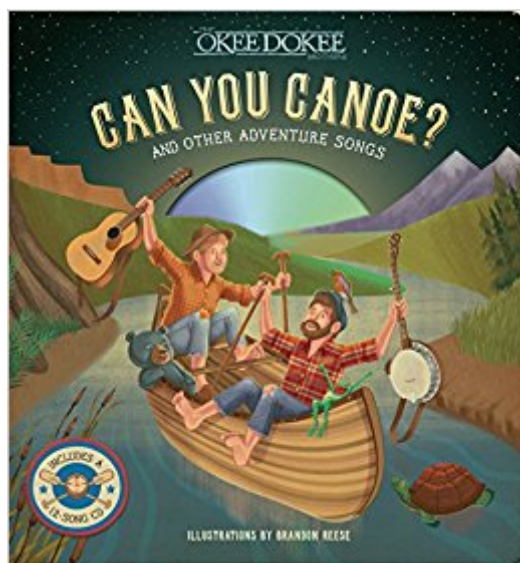

Children with even the slightest outdoorsy inclinations will be easily drawn into the songwriters' inviting descriptions of life under the stars (So I moved down to the river, / Where fishin' hooks pay the rent) and playful sights like The Bullfrog Opera or a beaver
