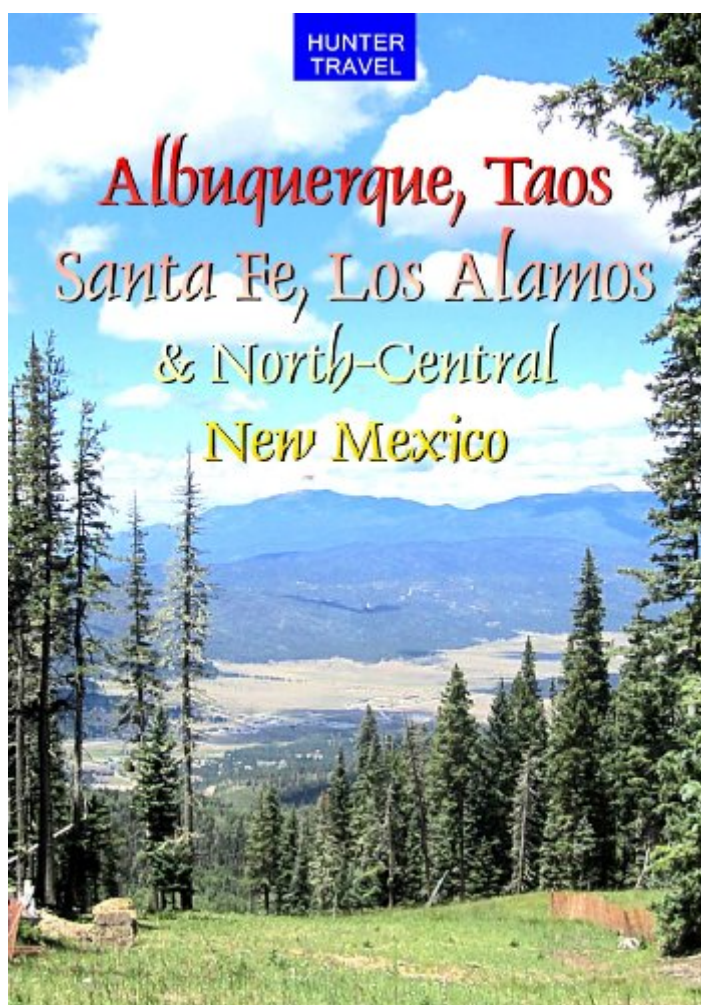

One could make a pretty good case for New Mexico being the most "foreign" of all states. The state's tri-culturalism is quite simply older than in the rest of the country. The Spanish explorer Coronado was combing New Mexico in search of the Seven Cities of Cibola in 1540 - 192 years before the birth of George Washington and nearly seven decades before the English laid the foundations of Jamestown in 1607. This guide focusses on the North-Central part of New Mexico, which is the region of the Rocky Mountains. Cimarron, Angel Fire, Los Alamos, Santa Fe, Taos, Albuquerque - these are some of the areas covered here, with complete details about the hikes and walks, the water trips, the biking, the cultural sights, the history and where to stay, including campsites, as well as the best restaurants.
