

arguments about the threats to women being seen and treated as fully-realized human beings now take on even more importance. By helping us see (and maybe question) so many absurdities of how life works for women and just "regular" folks... it makes us ask "yeah, why ARE things like that!?!" I think that laughter is one great way to get past the yelling at one another to find common ground and expose us to the essential truths in a more palatable way. Moran is skilled at doing this.

I can't say I found these vignettes very insightful or funny. Maybe the best one in these was the essay about how hard it is for her to get her printer to work, and in terms of timeliness it would have fit in perfectly around the turn of the millennium when Office Space was out. Generally speaking, there are just more interesting lives out there to read about.

This series of essays from The Times is absolutely excellent. There are a few that, though humorous, I didn't find that interesting but the rest-wow! Not only is Ms. Moran an excellent writer who knows how to keep it light, she has excellent insight and perspective. Her essay on the death of Margaret Thatcher alone is worth the whole book. It's great to have an author out there who can relate to the way most of us grew up. Keep them coming!
