

Born to a poor couple who were tenant farmers on a plantation in Mississippi, Anne Moody lived through some of the most dangerous days of the pre-civil rights era in the South. The week before she began high school came the news of Emmet Tillâ [™]s lynching. Before then, she had "known the fear of hunger, hell, and the Devil. But now there wasâ |the fear of being killed just because I was black." In that moment was born the passion for freedom and justice that would change her life.An all-A student whose dream of going to college is realized when she wins a basketball scholarship, she finally dares to join the NAACP in her junior year. Through the NAACP and later through CORE and SNCC she has first-hand experience of the demonstrations and sit-ins that were the mainstay of the civil rights movement, and the arrests and jailings, the shotguns, fire hoses, police dogs, billy clubs and deadly force that were used to destroy it.A deeply personal story but also a portrait of a turning point in our nationâ [™]s destiny, this autobiography lets us see history in the making, through the eyes of one of the footsoldiers in the civil rights movement.

My first read of Coming of Age was when I too was - I was 13 years old. Anne Moody writes with such clarity and illumination. This is autobiographical, so her family's business is "out-there" so to speak. She is the heroine, she is angry and because this was an era where racial oppression and inequality was still blatantly legislated, her rebellious spirit would not be contained.
