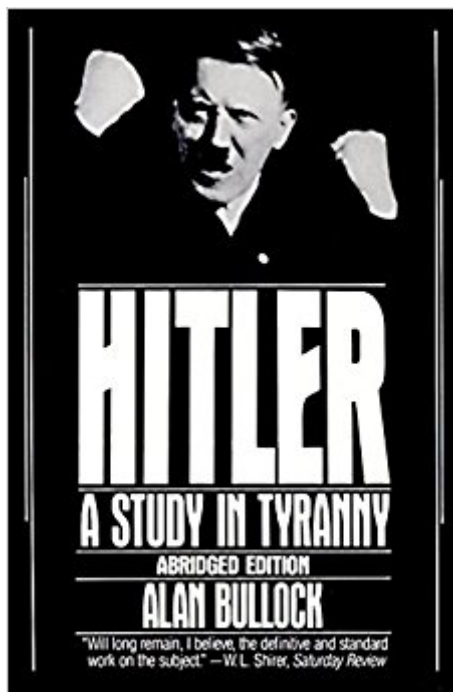

Alan Bullock, Baron Bullock, was born in 1914. He studied at Oxford University and served as a research assistant to Winston Churchill while writing his *A History of the English-Speaking Peoples*. He was a history fellow at New College, Oxford, helped found St Catherine's College, Oxford, and was Vice-Chancellor for the university. A renowned modern historian, Bullock was made a life peer in 1976. He died in 2004. --This text refers to an out of print or unavailable edition of this title.

For several years I was unable to find an inexpensive copy of Bullock. I had to read this book in three separate college courses. One was a social psychology course and this book kicked Nietzsche in practical application. I have found that even the students in this contemporary society who consider themselves too advanced and enormously put upon by our educational hopes, find this book enlightening and somewhat horrifying. Its the best gift I gave this year and it went to a soon to be freshman in high school.

The author is a famous British historian. In this book he adopts an interesting approach to history telling - he gives you the facts and events and leaves it up to you to make conclusions. Much more

information was uncovered since the book was written and the book misses a lot of facts, but it is still a solid work.

Alan Bullock wrote a very good and easy read about one of the worst people in history. I would recommend anyone interested in Hitler and the nazi's to read this along with William Shirer's " The Rise and Fall of the Third Reich " both great reading with lots of info.
