

# Deer Hunting With Jesus: Dispatches From America's Class War





## Synopsis

After 30 years spent scratching together a middle-class life out of a "dirt poor" childhood, Joe Bageant moved back to his hometown of Winchester, Virginia, where he realized that his family and neighbors were the very people who carried George W. Bush to victory. That was ironic, because Winchester, like countless American small towns, is fast becoming the bedrock of a permanent underclass. Two in five of the people in his old neighborhood do not have high-school diplomas. Nearly everyone over 50 has serious health problems, and many have no health care. Credit ratings are low or nonexistent, and alcohol, overeating, and Jesus are the preferred avenues of escape. A raucous mix of storytelling and political commentary, Deer Hunting with Jesus is Bageant's report on what he learned by coming home. He writes of his childhood friends who work at factory jobs that are constantly on the verge of being outsourced; the mortgage and credit-card rackets that saddle the working poor with debt, i.e., "white trashonomics"; the ubiquitous gun culture - and why the left doesn't get it; Scots Irish culture and how it played out in the young life of Lynddie England; and the blinkered "magical thinking" of the Christian right. (Bageant's brother is a Baptist pastor who casts out demons.) What it all adds up to, he asserts, is an unacknowledged class war. By turns brutal, tender, incendiary, and seriously funny, this book is a call to arms for fellow progressives with little real understanding of "the great beery, NASCAR-loving, church-going, gun-owning America that has never set foot in a Starbucks". Deer Hunting with Jesus is a potent antidote to what Bageant dubs "the American hologram" - the televised, corporatized virtual reality that distracts us from the insidious realities of American life.

I don't like giving 5 star ratings for books unless they are true masterpieces and will this one is close it has its issues. This book is guite unique and it is an insiders opinion piece but it is clearly an influential book. Its a very accessible read, which provides a great deal of commentary on the situation within the heartland of America. As an Australian, who used to live in the USA, but has since returned to my homeland in Australia, I left somewhat perplexed by the people who live in these areas. I have met Americas in these places who still think WW2 is going on - I kid you not, have had endless debates with them over guns, their definition of freedom, shared in their meals and home life all why they believe I came from a far away land somewhere near England, and as for American Christianity, well...as Joe says it's like playing Dungeons and Dragons. But what to make of these experiences, how can an Australian piece this together?Well, without spoiling the picture that Joe paints, this book goes a long way to helping with that guestion. I received the Australian Kindle version which includes an introduction tailored for down under but the main text is unaltered. Joe is clearly a learned man, but he doesn't write this in an Academic way however he retains depth and insight without have to render the terminology such as neo-liberalism, fundamentalism, free market economics and such, but presents it from the point of view of how someone sees these ideas as gospel and they arrive at this from an everyday point of view. In the end he provides no solutions to the problems that the protestant experiment has brought about, but in his defense, no one has any solutions. The achievement of this book is to give a language to describe how religion, economics, and America's particular definition of freedom and all intertwined and live. I tip my hat off to the man. A fine achievement.

Even though it was written a while back, this book is as current as ever to try and understand the lives and motivations of people living in small town America. The author is from a small town himself, before he was able to attend college thanks to a visionary government program and then came back. This results in a very personal perspective where he is able to use a gentle tone and provide personal examples. I wouldn't be surprised if Bernie Sanders had read this book to inform when developing his inclusive politics, sensitive to the needs of all Americans. A quick read, written in a witty style, and very relevant in this tumultuous election. I recommend it to all my friends.

The author has captured working class, middle America like no one else. I live in the decaying

remnant of a small town known for producing Eugene V. Debs and Theodore Dreiser. Today we are best known for political ineptitude and incestuous corruption. Reading this book has helped me understand why--functional illiteracy and immersion in the corporate hologram are, at least, first approximations of the underlying causes. Progressives who want to make a difference should forego their lattes and spends some time getting to know their neighbors before we are caught up in the "coming economic and ecological collapse."

I agree with the reviewer who wrote that Deer Hunting With Jesus is chilling and dead-on accurate. The same goes for Rainbow Pie by Joe Bageant. Bageant writes about poor and middle class whites, but also poor blacks and Hispanics.
