

Dana Claire Simpson grew up in Gig Harbor, Washington, drawing the entire time. She eventually graduated from The Evergreen State College, despite having spent all her time drawing, and not always for credit. Attempts at doing real work along the way are hardly worth mentioning; the relevant fact is that, from 1998 to 2008, she drew the internet comic strip Ozy and Millie. After winning the -sponsored Comic Strip Superstar Contest in 2009, Andrews McMeel Syndication signed her to a development deal for Heavenly Nostrils, which was later renamed Phoebe and Her Unicorn. She currently lives in Santa Barbara, California, with her tech genius husband and her fairly stupid cat.

Love this series! Can't wait to swipe (borrow) the book once my young daughter tires of it. She's already read it about 4 times. It's fun, whimsical and refreshing. While the story is a similar kind of plot as Calvin and Hobbes (a child and his/her talking animal friend), it really shines on it's own. The art is colorful, fun, and original. The characters are cute, fun, and silly, but also intelligent and 3-dimensional at the same time. Lots of witty banter and magical fun. I also really like that the

unicorn (Marigold) can actually be seen by Phoebe's parents. It is totally worth a owning \hat{A} \hat{c} \hat{A} "especially if you have a little girl (or you yourself reading funny, smart comics about sarcastic unicorns and their girls).

I bought the first four books thinking this would be an easy way to catch up on series. Not only did I catch up, but see I have already read the ones published currently. The books have ruined reading the strip as now I feel as if the paper on line I see this on is just looping the first four years and I am missing out on actual new ones. Buy the books but then don't bother looking for them in newspapers.

Very cute book with multi-dimensional characters and (for a book with a unicorn) grade school problems that are if anything, too real. On page 123 there's a misprint. It says "afoot" and obviously the author meant "aloof". Otherwise the pun doesn't work. Autocorrect strikes again.

My 6-year-old daughter loves these books! There aren't a lot of kid-safe graphic novels for girly girls. Girls can read graphic novels of any theme, of course, but my kiddo only likes to read about girl characters, and likes "pretty" graphics! But so many of the comics out there are aimed at teen and adult men, and aren't appropriate or empowering for younger female audiences. Graphic novels are a great way to promote independent reading, since they're hard to follow when read aloud by someone else. And they are great for teaching emotion recognition, with multiple facial expressions per page. And most introduce the thought versus speech concept, which is especially good for kids with social delays, who don't always realize that not everyone says what they think or means what they say.

My kid loves the sarcasm in Phoebe and the Unicorn books. At this point, I'm buying anything for her to read that she might find interesting to instill a love of reading. She is a little young for these at 7. The words are a little too big and we tend to read it together.

Another great Phoebe and her Unicorn book. My daughter read the entire book without putting it down. She loves the comic style of the books. She giggled the whole way through it.
