

I just took the Praxis 2 Middle School Math 5169 and passed. It was my second attempt. So I have seen 2 different versions of the test. I used this book as my primary resource on both attempts. I also checked out several other books at the library. This one is by far the closest to the actual test. Some of the reviews cite that the book and tests are full of mistakes. That is simply not true. There

are some errors. However, the author has compiled a list and will send you a PDF file of the errors and corrections if you request it by email. In my opinion, no single resource can adequately prepare you for the test. It also includes 2 additional 30 question tests. I want to offer some additional advice to test takers. The actual exam is harder that the exams in this book or any other test prep exams that I used. I was averaging 80% on the prep exams and failed the test the first time with a raw score of 26 which is less than 50% correct. That translated to a weighted score 153. (165 is the minimum score to pass in my state.) The weighted score is confusing \$\tilde{A}\tilde{A} \tilde{A} \tilde{I}\$ I did some research and found some minutes of an official meeting that discussed the difficulty of the 5169 test. The decision was that test takers need to get 31 out of 55 test questions correct in order to pass. That translated to a weighted score of 165. The second time I took the test, I scored a 173 with a raw score of 34. I would also like to recommend another book to help you study for the test. They sell it on . I am not sure they allow other books to be referenced in a review but it is a teal green color and it is for â Âœbeginning algebraâ Â• students. You can search for it with the words â ÂœA Plus $\tilde{A}\phi\hat{A}$ \hat{A} . I used both books in my preparation. Another word of advice when taking the testâ Â| Donâ Â™t spend any time on problems you are not sure how to solve. Just guess and move on. When I got my scores from ETS, I noticed that they had a category of A¢Â œraw points availableâ Â•. The number was 45 (but there are 55 questions so I called ETS for an explanation.) The short answer is that you are not going to get credit for 10 questions even if you scored 100%. So there are at least 10 questions that are â Âœvery difficultâ Â•. I found this to be that case when I took the test.

This has been a great resource but there are several mistakes on some of the test that need to be corrected. When one is studying and trying to pass the Praxis $\tilde{A}\phi\hat{A}$ \hat{A} " it is beneficial that the answers be correct!
