

Grade 5 Up-- Born a slave, Allen purchased his freedom in 1780 at the age of 20. Converted to Christianity by a Methodist circuit rider while still a slave, he moved to Philadelphia and preached at different churches. Against the wishes of church leaders, Allen established Bethel Church, the first Black Methodist Church, which became the mother church of the African Methodist Episcopal (AME) denomination. This book is interesting reading as well as a useful source for black history assignments. The writing is clear and straightforward, and the point of view is sympathetic. It provides not only a biography of the man but a portrait of life for free blacks in the post-Revolutionary era.
