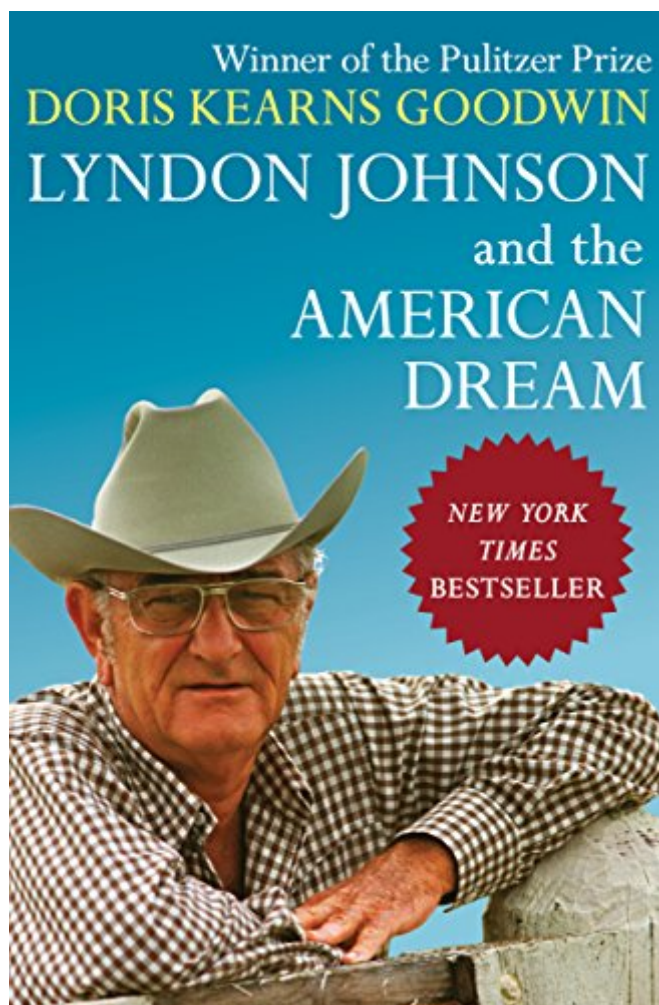

As always, DKG's writing style is lucid and eminently readable. That said, I would have imagined there would have been more of a tale to tell. Much is made of LBJ's mindset, which repeats itself throughout this story, as LBJ progresses from one level of governance to another. Then, the epilogue repeats the same stuff again. I'm left with a degree of sadness for the man, and relief the book came to an end.

I would have given this 5 stars but Doris Kearns Goodwin just gets into too much analysis from a psychological perspective. Keep in mind, however, that she was probably right about theories on LBJ. Her political views also come into play just a little too much. On the positive side, this was definitely worth reading. While she may have been biased with her political views, she is very quick to offer alternative points of view. Most importantly, her access to LBJ seems unprecedented. This book was definitely worth the time and money - I enjoyed it and look forward to doing more research on the President and his era.

I thought it was an excellent book. I've read Caro's four volumes and this really complemented those. I strongly recommend Robert Caro's works if you found this interesting.

Normally I love Doris Kearns Goodwin and a lot of the personal interaction between her and JFK was really interesting but a lot of politics was a little muddy and hard to follow. Maybe I was just more interested in his personal side that made him who he was or that the current day status of Congress is so dysfunctional that negotiating and positions described seem unreal.

While I knew most of the events described in this book, Goodwin brought them to life. I was fascinated by the insecurities of LBJ, who appeared on the outside to have none. This book is a must read for presidential history buffs. If you don't know much about LBJ, this book may raise him in your esteem. I know I regard him more highly than I did before reading this book.
