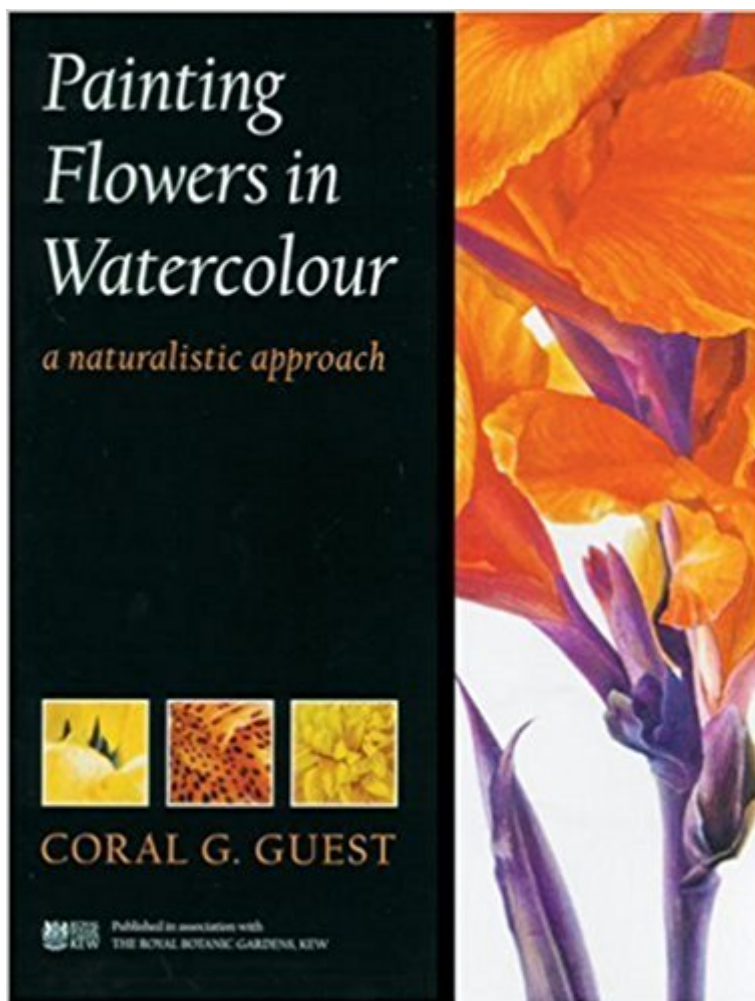

There are a number of good books in this genre, including Ann Blockely's comprehensive *Flower Painting Through the Seasons* (LJ 7/01), but Guest's book is among the best. It's an exquisite example of botanical rendering, reminiscent of the great work of artists like Pierre-Joseph Redoute. In my flower book collection I prefer: The Watercolor Flower Painter's A to Z by Fletcher, Painting Flowers A to Z by Sherry Nelson, and A - Z of Flower Portraits by Showell. I find the pictures in these 3 books to be more vibrant and a greater variety of flowers.
